Report of Town Historian – November 2024

Queries:

1) Tobias Devor, 108 Vineyard, asked for confirmation that his had once used as a jail. I could not find evidence to confirm that rumor, but I learned something about the history of jails: Jails were built on the county level, often in the basement of the courthouse. Newly captured prisoners were sometimes held for a day or two at the town level – sometimes in the home of the town justice. The 1887 Sanford Fire Insurance map of Lloyd shows a room in Deyo Hall (corner of Main and Vineyard) labeled “Court Ho[use] & Lockup”

2) Libbie Werlau, Town of Plattekill's Historian, asked if we had any photographs of the construction of the Mid-Hudson bridge. I found several, so she came for a visit and we found several she scanned for the article she was writing.

3) In researching Anthony Yelverton at Historic Huguenot Street, I found a document with his signature and seal, as well as that of many other New Paltz residents. I worked with Beth Patkus, HHS librarian, and we determined the document was signatures for a 1774 agreement in another part of the collection. The document is now displayed on the New York Heritage website – with the proper connection.

Donations:

1) I created a copy of the book I wrote which collected information about each Town of Lloyd Supervisor. I donated it to the Local History Room at the Highland library.

Franny Reese State Park:

1) I reviewed the final proposals for signs which Allison had prepared. I offered a couple suggestion for updates and corrections.

2) The sign proposals are currently being reviewed by Scenic Hudson and New York State Parks.es.

Slave Cemetery:

1) I am working with a descendant of Anthony Yelverton to locate his Account Book which was sold at a Swann Auction in 2015.

**Water Department**

1. River water is making-up 98% daily production.

4. Marine Diving Service was on site and provided an underwater inspection of the intake in reservoir #5. It was noted the intake is missing some screens and is allowing eels in.

**Road Crew**

1. The issues with the Bridgeview pump station have been resolved. We have had Hydra-Numatics on site for troubleshooting and repairs, they returned several times. JTP was on site to vac out the bottom of the wet well and repair/retrofit the suction line, flange and gasket below the pump station mounting plate. This was a time consuming and costly repair.

**WHEREAS**, a public hearing has been held thereon on the 4th day of December 2024 at 4:00 p.m. at which time all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard thereon; and,

**WHEREAS**, the within local law is a Type II action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and is exempt from further proceedings under such act.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Town Board of the Town of Lloyd that Local Law H-2024 be enacted as in the form attached hereto as Schedule “A” as fully as if set forth herein, being **A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 96 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF LLOYD ENTITLED “VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC”, §96-6.3 “PAID PARKING ZONES & ADDITIONAL NO PARKING ZONES WITHIN THE TOWN”**.

LOCAL LAW H – 2024

**A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 96 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF LLOYD ENTITLED “VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC” SECTION 96-6.3 “PAID PARKING ZONES & ADDITIONAL NO PARKING ZONES WITHIN THE TOWN” AS FOLLOWS:**

December 4, 2024

Section 1

The Code of the Town of Lloyd, Chapter 96, entitled “Vehicles and Traffic,” Article III, “Parking, Stopping, Standing and Truck Traffic” is hereby amended by deleting the existing “§ 96-6.3 “Paid Parking Zones & Additional No Parking Zones Within The Town (A) (I – III)”and replacing same as follows:

“A. The Town Board of the Town of Lloyd hereby establishes paid parking zones within the Town of Lloyd. Said paid parking zones shall be established by the Town Board by resolution and may be amended from time to time.”

Section 2. Severability

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of Town of Lloyd hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 3. Authority

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law. This Local Law shall supersede the provisions of Town Law to the extent it is inconsistent with the same, and to the extent permitted by the New York State Constitution, the Municipal Home Rule Law, or any other applicable statute.

Section 4. Effective Date

This law shall take effect upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law.
